

HEDIS Glossary

- Denominator = Eligible population for clinical measure
- Numerator = Members within Denominator that met measure criteria
- Rate = Numerator/Denominator. There is an Admin rate and a HEDIS Project rate
- Enrollment = Period of time member must be enrolled with Anthem before becoming eligible for the Denominator.
- Administrative Measure = Clinical measure that is rated solely on administrative data alone
- Administrative data can include: Claims, Encounters, RX, Vendor, Lab and Supplemental files.
- Hybrid Measure = Clinical measure that is rated based on both administrative data and Medical Record Review and usually a 411 sample size per county/region.
- MPL = Minimum Performance Level = NCQA 50th Percentile and DHCS Requirement
- HPL = High Performance Level = NCQA 90th Percentile

W30 Well Child Visits in the first 30 Months of Life

(An expansion of W15)

1. Rate 1: Well-Child Visits in the First 15 Months. Children who turned 15 months old during the measurement year. Requires Six or more well-child visits. (Same as W15)
2. Added Rate 2: Well-Child Visits for Age 15 Months–30 Months. Children who turned 30 months old during the measurement year. Requires Two or more well-child visits
3. Removed Hybrid Sample for HEDIS Project. Rates based on entire eligible population and using administrative data.
4. Added to allowance of telehealth visits to count for compliance.

WCV Child and Adolescent Well-Care Visits (Combination of W34 and AWC)

1. WCV combined and replaced W34 (ages 3-6) and AWC (ages 12-21) and added a third age band of ages 7-11
2. Removed Hybrid Sample for HEDIS Project. Rates based on your entire eligible population and using administrative data.
3. Added to allowance of telehealth visits to count for compliance.
